"Here Am I. Send Me!" These are some of the words from Isaiah 6:8. We have chosen them for our "memory verse" for February. I shared a little of the background when I introduced this verse at the beginning of the month. Please allow me to repeat some of what I said then as well as elaborate a

Isaiah the prophet lived and wrote around 750 B.C. It seems that Israel had drifted away from God. Their worship was impressive but empty- "When you come to appear before me, who asked this of you, this trampling of my courts? Stop bringing meaningless offerings! Your incense is detestable to me." (1: 12.13). Their lifestyle was one of self-indulgence.- "Woe to those who rise early in the morning to run after their drinks, who stay up late at night till they are inflamed with wine." (5:11) Their morals were mixed up- "Woe to those who call evil good and good evil..." (5:20).

Isaiah then sees God on His throne in all His grandeur, holiness and glory (6:1-4). He feels completely unc lean and unworthy until he is cleansed by an angel of God (6:5-7). He then hears the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?" That is when Isaiah says "Here am I send me!" (6:8) God then shares with Isaiah what he could expect, that many would not listen (6:9-13). Part of this section (6:9-10) is used by Jesus (Matthew 13:14,15) as he shares the parable of the sower.

What can we glean from these passages? First, our world desperately needs to turn to God, we are people who often stray. Second, when we see God in His holiness we realize how sinful we are, we need the cleansing that only He provides. Third, we ought to feel a sense of duty coupled with a great honor to share God's salvation with those around us. Fourth, though many will not listen, some seed will fall on good soil and produce a crop, yielding a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown (Mt. 13:23). Let's sow the seed, the word of God (Lu. 8:11).

A simple definition of confession could be, "bringing to light." Bringing it all to God. Opening ourselves before God. Laying ourselves bare before him. Leaving nothing for ourselves. Giving it all to HIM. Giving him the good, that he may be glorified. Giving him the bad, than he may redeem it, and in doing so be glorified.


