From The Shepherd's Pen



I have always loved to read. So has my wife Kathy. When you visit our house, you will see shelves of books in the living room the office, the hallway, Kathy's sewing room, and our bedroom. When I retired, I brought 27 crates and boxes of books from my office that are now stored in our garage, awaiting either our purchase of even more bookshelves or their replacement. We have a lot of books!

The books you will find at our place are of all types, including classic literature, mysteries, thrillers, biographies, histories, travel guides, cookbooks, and, importantly for this article, a wide variety of religious and spiritual texts. Before he passed away, my dad would often stand in front of our bookshelves looking at the book titles that I then had and would invariably say, "You know that the only necessary book is the Bible." He was right.

But still I read beyond the Old and New Testaments. I do so in order to see what others have said about biblical texts, to better understand the passages' meanings and their applications to this life of ours. Over time I have found a number of books which have proven to be very insightful and helpful to me. If you are a reader of Christian materials, you might find one or more of the following books to be not only interesting to you, but also helpful in your understanding of scripture and of how we should live.

F. F. Bruce's <u>Paul: Apostle of the Heart Set Free</u> draws from all of Paul's letters to discuss the key components of the apostle's beliefs. Other excellent books by this writer are <u>The Hard Sayings of Jesus</u> and <u>Peter, Stephen, James, and John</u>.

Philip Yancey's <u>What's So Amazing About Grace</u> is the best book I have ever read on the topic of grace. If you like devotionals that offer a reading for each day of the year, Simon Gillebaud's <u>Choose Life: 365 Readings for Radical Disciples</u> is really the best daily devotional I have ever used. Two others which are excellent are Timothy Keller's <u>God's Wisdom for Navigating Life</u> and The Songs of Jesus.

David P. Gushee's <u>The Sacredness of Human Life</u>: <u>Why an Ancient Biblical Vision Is Key to the World' Future</u> discusses the history and real-life implications of believing that life is sacred.

James Emery White's <u>The Church in an Age of Crisis</u>: <u>25 New Realities Facing Christianity</u> analyzes a wide variety of present-day circumstances and beliefs that challenge the Christian life and the church.

Larry Osborne's 10 Dumb Things Smart Christians Believe discusses and debunks "urban myths" which have crept into modern Christian thought.

Erwin Raphael McManus' The Last Arrow: Save Nothing for the Next Life inspired me to re-think how I was really living.

These are a few of my favorites. I hope you might find one or more of them interesting and challenging. However, whatever you read, please read discerningly. Always recall Paul's praise of the Bereans who examined the scriptures daily to see if what he told them was true. (Acts 17: 11)
