

Feeding on the Word

When the Apostle Paul talks about the **resurrection** he speaks from a different perspective than the eye witness narratives of the Gospels. Paul was highly educated in the legal aspects of God's word and this *by the book* approach actually kept him from recognizing Jesus as Lord, the anointed of God. Then, one day Saul had his own **resurrection** experience. His eyes were opened, his heart was changed and his life would never be the same. Out of that personal conversion experience, Paul later writes a letter to the Christians at Corinth reaffirming **love** as the basis for problem solving and firmly establishing the **Resurrection of Jesus** as the very center and core of our faith. Without it, he says, **"Our faith is meaningless."** See you in **I Corinthians 15** in a few minutes!

All In

Someone once asked me an odd question: "If you knew that there was no life after death, no heaven or hell, would you still be a Christian?" Obviously, I found this question to be very strange, especially coming from another Jesus follower. I mean, why would I even want to imagine no Heaven? All that I could think of was how I didn't want to seem like I was a Christian just for my own reward, so I suggested that I would in fact still try to live out the example that Jesus left us to follow. Yet, the question lingered with me for some time, years in fact. Truthfully, it has turned out to be a deeply motivating question in my walk of faith.

In 1 Corinthians 15, Paul is writing in defense and confirmation of the resurrection, both ours and Jesus'. In verse 19 he says, "If only for this life we have hope in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied." There is some deep theology behind Paul's statement here. He's specifically addressing a false teaching that was prevalent in that particular time and setting, that there was in fact no physical resurrection. Yet, his words should cut deeply for us even today if we consider their implication. Why would we be pitied if there was no life after death, no resurrection? Think about what Paul's life looked like. He gave up quite a life to serve and advance the gospel of Jesus. After living a life completely dedicated to the Lord, if it turned out that he was wrong, he certainly would have looked foolish. Can the same thing be said about your life? Typically, we tend to hedge our bets a little. In the pie chart of our lives, we have a slice for church, and there's still room for a lot of other things that are important to us as well. When it comes down to it, if we were wrong about the whole eternal life bit, most of us would have still lived comfortable and rewarding lives. Jesus did not ask to have a slice of the pie chart of your life. He said in Luke 9:23 "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me." As Christians, we are supposed to have gone all in for Jesus. Our faith in Christ, our confession of Him as Lord and savior, and our baptism into his death are all founded upon the fact that there is a resurrection and life after death. If we are wrong about that, we will have lost everything. Yet when our Lord returns and our faith is made sight, we will indeed gain abundantly more than we could ask or imagine

Reading again that verse in 1 Corinthians 15, there's the word "only". Our hope in Christ is for life after death and praise God for that! As if that wasn't enough though, that's not all of the story. We do also have hope in Christ for this life! Romans 6:3-4 says "Or don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life." When we emerge from the symbolic, watery grave of baptism, we have undergone a powerful resurrection. We are set free from the death that sin brings. We needn't live with sorrow and anxiety about it any longer. We have been blessed with a new life in the same way that Christ was, and that new life is far more hope filled than a life outside of Christ.

Because the tomb is empty, our citizenship is in heaven, and we should be watchfully and eagerly awaiting our savior from there. However, that doesn't mean that we don't have a purpose till then. In the Lord's prayer in Matthew 6, Jesus prayed for God's kingdom to come and his will to be done on earth, just as it is in heaven. Have you ever considered the fact that God answered that prayer? By His spirit, He raised Jesus from the dead here on this earth, and he has placed the same spirit in each one of us who have been raised with Him. Have you gone "all in" in your faith because of his resurrection, seeking first His kingdom here on earth, or are you still hedging that bet by building your own kingdom just in case? - Charlie DeLong
