Secrets

Tucked away in **Romans 14:22** is a peculiar little passage that has become a meaningful mantra: "Whatever you believe about these things keep between yourself and God." Really?!

In **Romans 14** Paul reminds us not to judge each other over matters God allows and to be sensitive lest we undermine the faith of the spiritually weak. He reminds the church that unity and peace can prevail despite various understandings and convictions that allow one to participate while another should not. Paul describes practices, none of which are wrong in themselves, which are culturally driven or faith based involving Jewish believers and former pagans who do not yet understand the truth that celebrating "holidays" and partaking of all food and drink are acceptable.

Romans 14 is Paul telling the church, if your conscience allows you to eat meat sacrificed to idols, drink wine, celebrate various days, or participate in other things that are morally and spiritually neutral, do so, or don't, understanding that the kingdom of God is not about special days or what you eat or drink. You are free, he says, to abstain or partake but either way conduct yourself in a way that promotes peace, mutual edification, and does not cause your "good" to be spoken of as "evil" (i.e. something that is causing harm).

There are some instances where Paul says its best to keep your opinions, convictions, and practices to yourself, or at least don't make them a public issue or bait for controversy. The apostle is giving Christians permission to enjoy all good things as long as it is done in a way that does not violate your conscience, divide the body of Christ, or undermine the faith of a weaker Christian who has not yet learned that these things are permissible. How do we do that?

Paul's solution is to give apostolic guidance to invoke "Don't ask, don't tell." (I Corinthians 10:25f). He is also very clear that we should not force others to conform to what we may or may not choose to do or believe in certain areas realizing some issues are matters of personal conscience and interpretation and are not kingdom issues. These should not be made tests of fellowship or faithfulness, for God has accepted the one who disagrees with you, so you then should accept them without judgment (Romans 14:3). Some things are best kept between you and God while treating others with discretion and discernment in a way that encourages "righteousness, peace and joy in the Holy Spirit."

Each of us has room to grow and yet I believe our wonderfully diverse church family does this well. I encourage us to continue to grant each other freedom in Christ to do as our conscience allows while not judging or condemning others for either partaking or abstaining, nor to use our freedoms as an occasion of stumbling to those weak in faith.

May we continue to honor and obey God as we treat each other with sacrificial love for the sake of unity in the body of Christ! ... "So, whatever you believe about these things keep between yourself and God."
