Overdressed

A church in Abilene, TX last week had an awkward Jesus moment. On a Sunday morning a lady took her top off. Yep, she was nude from the waist up...in church. Images of her being tackled, reprimanded and cast out on the street may be flashing through your mind but here is what transpired (slightly edited):

As it turns out the topless lady was *high* and had little idea of where she was or what she was doing. A sweet older sister in Christ (most churches are blessed with several of these wise, experienced, *l've'* seen it all, unflappable saints), an elder, and another younger lady quickly gathered around the topless woman, gently escorted her to a more private area and kindly but directly asked her how they might help. The wise older lady started the conversation with, "Honey." Not as in, "HONEY! You done messed up now girl! This is a CHURCH! How dare you! Get out and stay out...!" Rather, "Honey, you look like you could use some help. Let's get you back into your bra and blouse and help find you a place where you can sober up..."

We know how Jesus handled encounters like this: The disreputable woman at the well (John 4), the scandalous lady caught in adultery (John 8), Peter's foul-mouthed betrayal of Jesus (Luke 22). Pick one of your less than stellar moments and see how gently and compassionately the perfect Son of God treats you.

There are many wise souls among us who are not strangers to dirty, difficult, and awkward situations and who encounter the hurting and misguided and, as Jesus did, treat them with compassion and love encouraging them to change, guiding them on a new path, and helping re-dress them with the beautiful clothes of Christ. I am confident our church, if faced with a similar awkward situation, would act like Jesus did in a direct but loving, firm but gentle way with a grace-filled offer of help and an encouragement to walk away from destructive choices.

What may be more alarming than the above event is that in American Christianity it has become too common to think people need to have all their messes cleaned up or covered up before they come to "church." May we never forget or disregard Jesus' words, "It's the sick who need a doctor."

And, consider the often **overlooked flip side to this** *topless coin*. How many go to church "**overdressed**" every Sunday in the fake but fancy garments of "*I've got it all together*." Like Adam and Eve, we come wearing our properly placed fig leaves hiding whatever form our sin has taken this week.

How about you? It may be easy to be critical of one coming to church **under-dressed** but how often do we come to church **over-dressed, pretending** everything is fine, **concealing** what needs to be **exposed** and **undressed** by the light of God's transforming truth?

Can you help?

We still have a few needs for making CCYC happen this year. We are in need of the following items for the kitchen staff: pot holders/oven mitts extra large pots, pans, bowls, and colanders. The bigger the better as Dielle and her crew are cooking for a crowd! We won't need to transport the same students back on Saturday, so it'd just be a Sunday afternoon commitment.

While this camp provides a very special and unique opportunity for deep spiritual growth, it is expensive. The registration for the week is \$295.
