Four Keys to Happiness

Most people are looking for “happiness”, whatever that is! It is really not wrong to search for “happiness”. It **is** important to know what “happiness” **is** and thereby to know what you are looking for. It is also important to know **where** to find it when you know **what** it is. Jesus once said, “The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have **life**, and have it to the full.” (John 10:10). Jesus has a lot to say about happiness (real **life**), both here and now and in the hereafter. I wonder how happy we can be **now** if we don’t have the **hereafter** figured out. One song once stated “I’ve been looking for love in all the wrong places”, and I think the lyrics could easily be adapted to the subject at hand, “I’ve been looking for happiness in all the wrong places.”

Of all things, and contrary to our basic desires and our cultural obsessions of getting stuff and having fun, happiness is found in giving and not getting. In fact Paul summed up his life and the life and teachings of Jesus with these words to the Ephesian elders at Miletus, “In everything I did, I showed you that by this kind of hard work we must help the weak, remembering the words the Lord Jesus himself said: “**It is more blessed to give than to receive**” (Acts 20:35). **And so I propose that one key to happiness is learning to give rather than wanting to receive all the time.**

Another key to happiness is involvement in worthwhile and eternal pursuits. Sometimes I get tired of fixing up things, or even buying things that just don’t last. Are the things we are pursuing lasting? Jesus once said, “What good will it be for a man if he gains the whole world, yet forfeits his soul?” (Matthew 16:26). He also said, “Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moth and rust do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal. (Matthew 6:19,20) None of us can be happy for long if we know that everything we love and live for will fail us or be destroyed. As one gospel songs says, “build your hopes on things eternal, hold to God’s unchanging hand.”

A third key to happiness, related to the second one just discussed above of “involvement in worthwhile and eternal pursuits” **is sharing the good news with others.** Jesus once sent out 72 workers into the field preaching the gospel. Here is what the Bible records at their return after their little “mission trip.” “The seventy-two returned with **joy** and said, ‘Lord, even the demons submit to us in your name’” (Luke 10:17). A church active in outreach is a happier church. Whenever I go on mission trips and come back I always want to share the joy with those who sent me. It happens every time. Just wait until our group gets back from Honduras. They will be full of joy and want to share.

A fourth key to our happiness is knowing of our eternal reward in Heaven. Notice what Jesus said to those who came back so full of joy from their mission trip. “I saw Satan fall like lightning from heaven...However, do not rejoice that the spirits submit to you, but rejoice that your names are written in heaven.” (Luke 10:18—20).

So, there they are, four keys to happiness: **1. Giving rather than getting. 2. Involvement in worthwhile and eternal pursuits. 3. Sharing you faith. And 4. Knowing you have a heavenly reward.**
