Sips from the well (by Doug Clayton)

Reason

We woke up two Sundays ago to learn 49 people had been brutally murdered in Orlando. Just as the shock wore off we heard about a young family relaxing by a lagoon in the shadow of the Magic Kingdom watch in horror as an alligator snatches their little boy with his powerful jaws and drags him under the murky water to his death. We are stunned and speechless at the depths of such loss. We hold our loved ones closer, hug our children tighter and longer and we pray.

Most of us have experienced enough to understand evil does not discriminate, pain is randomly dispensed, accidents happen, and disease and disaster arbitrarily bring suffering in our ordered but often unpredictable universe. And, contrary to contemporary cliché, everything **DOES NOT** "happen for a reason!" Two year old boys don't get dragged off and eaten by alligators for some higher cosmic purpose! Nightclub patrons don't get slaughtered for some noble reason we can't yet seem to comprehend. I really wish people (especially Christians) would stop saying that. It sounds pseudo religious and does nothing to help alleviate anyone's grief and pain. To the contrary, it suggests God is constantly messing with his creation like a cosmic cat toying with a doomed mouse, gleefully orchestrating horror, callously inflicting injury while the perplexed humans try to figure out how painful puzzle pieces fit together so evil and suffering have a proper "reason" to keep hanging around.

I think people mean well when they toss out that trite phrase (BTW, I won't Un-Friend you if you use it) but let's not assume it's true or that it comes from God. The Bible never says, "Everything happens for a reason." **But, God does remind us that we live in a fallen world (There's your "reason.") and despite everything bad He relentlessly works to bring about good in the midst of it.** That's quite different from implying God inflicts suffering and if perceptive enough we will solve the riddle and reason we were *so "fortunate"* to get cancer, lose our job, or have our arm mangled in a tree shredder.

God's desire is to bless and give good gifts. He does not give us rocks when we ask for bread or snakes instead of fish (Matthew 7:9-11). Jehovah does not tempt us or cause evil (Job, James 1). He abhors and is deeply saddened by all suffering and injustice as He promises to relentlessly work in the midst of pain to bring about good. This oath is sealed in the blood of his Son Jesus, declaring nothing can ever separate us from God's love (Romans 8:28-39) and all creation will one day be restored in a real Magic Kingdom where children don't die and nothing sad, bad or painful ever happens again! (2 Peter 3:13, Revelation 21:1-4)

We find our "reason" as we become vessels of God's healing in embracing outcasts, easing burdens, spreading hope and bringing shalom into a world full of chaos and suffering. Trust every kindness and compassion has deep value. Know every gesture of love and offering of grace ripples throughout eternity. Believe every innocent defended is an extension of God's justice in an unjust world.

Evil men and alligators don't get the last word. God does! The empty tomb of Jesus is the clear and victorious shout that God's side wins! So, live! Love! Trust! Pray! Rejoice! See the **good!** Be the **good!** And behold heaven come to earth through God's Spirit at work in us!
