Sips from the Well (by Doug Clayton)

Proximity

"Absence makes the heart grow fonder" may be the worst piece of relationship advice ever. I admit there could be a grain of truth in it; if you are married and already committed for life, a brief, productive time apart would cause you to truly miss and appreciate your mate more, rethink how you might treat them better, resolve to be a more unselfish spouse, and grow fonder as you look forward to a joyful reunion. However, the longer we are absent from someone the more and more we adjust to being away from them and instead of our relationship growing deeper, more intimate, and "fonder," the opposite happens; we become more detached, inattentive, communication decreases and growth and intimacy grind to a halt. Those who experience extended absence from a loved one due to work, deployment, etc., know this feeling of disconnect. An absent heart can easily grow cold and unfamiliar until finally the relationship dries up and at best what remains are a few fond memories of what should have been were proximity instead of absence the reality.

As you have already figured out this article is not primarily so much about dating or marriage advices as it is about you and God. Too many attempt an absentee relationship with God, infrequently interrupted by making the obligatory Sunday visit to church (as if God was in jail and needed us to come see him once a week). We, like the disciples in the Garden on that Thursday night, can too easily fall asleep when Jesus is not in close proximity.

How much time, thought, and effort do you expend seeking, listening, and nurturing your relationship with the Lord Jesus? Yes, I know you know who God is, you believe in him and you have probably even been baptized and read the Bible once in a while. You likely occasionally ask God for stuff ("pray") and you might even sit for an hour or so a week mouthing words to songs and listening to others talk about Him, and maybe you even wear the t-shirt, the religious jewelry or "tat," or periodically post a social media note suggesting those who *really* love God as they should will share or "like" a religious slogan or Bible verse.

If your relationship with Jesus was a marriage (it is BTW) would it be healthy, fulfilling, joyful, self-examining, and personal? Are you satisfied with mere acquaintance with God or do you desire intimacy? Do you want a transforming connection as the Holy Spirit lives in you, or are you good with a distance learning affiliation with the Lord, one you can conveniently log into and out of when it suits you? Do you want to take a guess as to why you find yourself in the same rut of stagnant spirituality and wonder why Faith often feels superficial, why your spiritual rhythms are always up or down, high or low, hot or cold, inspiring or dull, stimulating or...yawn... all the time? **Absence** doesn't work in human relationships and it certainly doesn't work with God either.

If we make it a *holy habit* to spend quality time with Jesus, walk with him, talk with him, listen to him, learn who he is and what gives him joy and pleasure, we will never want to be absent from him again. *"Come near to God and He will come near to you"* (James 4:8).
