The word "missional" has become a common religious buzzword. Its one thing to stick a phrase on a letterhead or marquee and hope by some miracle a church actually becomes that. It's quite another matter for each individual disciple of Christ to live life with deliberate intent to bring the kingdom of heaven to earth in everything they do, every day. Christopher Wright said it like this: "It is not so much that God has a mission for his church in the world, but that God has a church for his mission in the world."

Christian churches have long defined our mission as "To seek and save the lost." That's a noble and even Jesus sounding phrase. However, it's ironic that most churches have leaned toward doing just the opposite. Instead of being churches that "Go and be, seek and save," too many have become exclusive, protective institutions that beckon, "Come and see. Come and experience. Come and do it correctly."

When we become the mission, our focus turns outward and we join God in what He is doing in the world, now! For too long Western churches have subscribed (erroneously IMO) to the Enlightenment mindset that all things are pointing exclusively and only to a post-resurrection existence composed of disembodied spirits (us) who go to place far, far away called "Heaven" and participate in some kind of eternal church service. **Doesn't** sound much like heaven to me! And the assumption has been that this "Heaven" has no connection to what we experience on earth and what God is doing on earth right now. Consequently, we excuse ourselves from **being** and **doing** today as we wait for that *yonder* home in the sky completely removed from earth. If we can catch a glimpse of what Jesus saw as he continually sought to bring heaven and earth together (Matt. 6:10) we may realize the implications of the resurrection are far broader and more glorious than we imagined.

When Jesus broke free from the grave he had accomplished much more than defeating death. The Lamb's victory over the tomb is a call to his followers to act now, on earth. Every gesture of compassion, child rescued, water well purified, marriage transformed, truth told, 2nd mile traveled, judgment withheld, grace extended, is revealing itself as the way it was always intended to be on earth and will be again after the resurrection.

Each incident of truth, goodness, and love, right now, no matter how small, is a piece of Jehovah's majestic redeeming puzzle gradually bringing heaven and earth ever closer together until that day when He wonderfully restores all things and unites heaven and earth in a real place; not where disembodied spirits float around on clouds playing harps, but where the redeemed actually live again (just like Jesus did) in resurrected, glorified, imperishable bodies (I Cor. 15), inhabiting a "new heaven-earth home" (2 Peter 3:13), enjoying a perfected and restored condition beyond our wildest imagination. Now there's a reason to live missionally!
