The message of Jesus is a message of love. Love has a healing power. It enables us to overcome past hurts and disappointments. Loving others is a risk. Our affections and efforts will not always be welcomed. Loving requires courage to continue when rejection or ridicule or unpleasant recollections surface. Love can rejuvenate us. It can give us new life, new purpose, new hope.

Our new "life groups" are an attempt to revive and deepen the love we Christians have for God and for each other. We begin today to make these groups a place of encouragement, learning, sharing and loving. At times in my career as a minister people say to me, "I don't feel a part of the church" or "it seems people ignore me" or "others don't seem to care for me" or "If I left no one would notice." Life groups are a great opportunity to reconnect, to re-establish relationships, to recommit to loving one another.

Give God and others another chance. "This is the message you heard from the beginning: We should love one another....We know that we have passed from death to life, because we love our brothers. Many Christians are asked about various subjects, everything from God's role or lack thereof in various events to inquiries about some simple piece of information. If you don't know, "I don't know" is not only the truthful response, but the humble, God honoring response. As you might imagine I am often asked specific questions about topics for which ministers are assumed to have answers. The assumption is that not only do "The secret things belong to God" (Deuteronomy 29:29) but the secrets of the universe also belong to me, or theologians or really smart people with light speed web service.

While writing this (no kidding!), I got a phone call asking me a question. You guess it, I said, "I don't know." As I did a strange feeling of freedom washed over me. It's not important that we know all, or most, or even some of the answers to questions we are often asked. It is more honest, more humble, more liberating to simply say, "I don't know." Such admissions of ignorance can be a bit uncomfortable, especially if people are in the habit of turning to you for answers and you are in the habit of feeling you must always provide one. Certainly there is always a place for godly advice and counsel, yet we must fight the temptation to be the answer person, as if our words somehow had the power to fix the inquirers' problem, solve the life mystery, or remove the struggle.

I love the image of a pilgrim on a long, difficult trek up the mountain to find the guru. When the pilgrim finally reaches the top he finds the short, bald, bearded guru sitting wearing a robe, and asks him the meaning of life. The guru, in between several very long, meditative pauses usually gives a vague response, answers in a question of his own, or simply says, "Sorry you came all the way up here but if I knew the answer to that I wouldn't be up here myself."

I see well intended people often attempting to respond as if they know more than they actually do. Sometimes we even attempt to solve the mystery by assigning God credit or blame for our choices. Such is a very slippery and subjective practice. Yes, God can do and has done many things, yet we must be cautious about assigning actions to God that may be more a result of the natural flow of a fallen creation or our imperfect choices than they are His desire or actions. Make no mistake, I do know that God can and will work meticulously and relentlessly in our life to bring about good in any situation (Romans 8:28). I do know there is a God, and I do know that I am not him.

If I were the guru my answer might be: "Who you know is much more important that what you know...(long, meditative pause)... Now be careful walking down the mountain."

This week practice the spiritual discipline of saying, "I don't know."
