Autograph

Last week we went to Denver to visit my son and his wife on his birthday and attended a Colorado Rockies game. When we got to the stadium I discovered a Rockies player, the older Brother of a friend of mine who pitched for the minor league Grand Junction Rockies, had left us complimentary tickets behind home plate; an awesome gift arranged by two Brothers! I went over to the bullpen to thank the older Brother for the tickets and when I arrived he was kneeling and praying along with two other players (One of those brief but perfect moments in time). I happily waited as they finished talking with God and then yelled down to the older Brother. He looked up and smiled. I told him who I was and thanked him for the tickets. He thanked me for taking his little brother fishing and looking out for him this summer. His younger Brother had earlier gifted me with an autographed baseball which I had brought to the game. The older Brother graciously signed it too and tossed it back up to me. We briefly exchanged small talk and God's blessings and then he went back to work throwing a ball 98 mph and I went back to my seat.

An autograph is a **validation** of one's identity, **"This is my name. This is who I am."** What the autograph does not and cannot tell is a player's story. Behind the signature is an entire life with family, friends, struggles, hopes, hobbies, relationships, flaws, favorite foods, dreams, love, an entire uniquely created person and personality represented by a few ink strokes on a ball.

This bullpen encounter reminded me about another older Brother, one who hung on a cross and signed his name in blood validating the greatest love story ever told. When Jesus was suspended on the cross a coarse name plate hung over his head. Someone had sarcastically scribbled, "This is Jesus, King of the Jews." The detached writer likely gave little thought to the bloodied and beaten body that hung below; his family, his teaching, the love, the gentleness, the compassion, the miracles, the sacrifice, the death, the sinless person behind the story of God's relentless desire to redeem all humanity. An autograph can reveal only so much.

I have an autograph from Johnny Bench, the Hall of Fame catcher of the Cincinnati Reds. I met him once, very briefly, as I refueled his chartered airplane at 5 AM while working my way through Lipscomb University many years ago. I can honestly say I value my "Brothers" autographed ball much more than Johnny Bench's autograph. You see, I don't know anything about Mr. Bench except that he was a remarkably talented baseball player. I do know something about the "Brothers." I have spent time with one of them. I know the lives they represent. I know a little about their family, their values, we share a college alma mater and roots in Tennessee. I know most of all that the "Brothers" are people of deep and sincere faith in Jesus and because of that we are brothers in Christ, bonded forever as divine siblings because of the authentic blood stained autograph of the Son of God.

As I walked back from the bullpen to my seat last Friday night I smiled as I looked at the baseball. The older Brother had written his name just under his younger Brother's name. And just below, as part of his signature, validating who he is, was the simple but profound testimony of a Brother's faith in Jesus, "Matt. 6:33." The perfect autograph!
