is it Weakness?

My wife loves horses. I try to share in her enthusiasm and interest, but sometimes it is easier than others. Recently, she was showing me a video of a world champion reigning horse and trainer that she'd met. Reigning is a tremendously technical equine sport where a rider demonstrates extremely high levels of control over his or her horse while performing what seems like simple maneuvers. After watching this video, I tried to seem excitedly interested, but it just looked like horse riding to me, as I didn't really know what to look for. She explained to me the details of the horse's behavior, and the more I observed, the more I was impressed. After meeting the horse in the video for myself, I was even more impressed. He was a stud horse, which means he still has all of the testosterone that comes with being able to reproduce. Most male horses are gelded at a young age, as the abundance of hormones makes them very unpredictable, difficult to train, and often even very dangerous. If anyone was to describe impressive equine specimen, over 1500 lbs. of rock solid, bulging muscles would certainly not bring to mind the word "weak".

"Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the Earth." Mt. 5:5. Often, meekness, or quiet, gentle submissiveness is mistaken for spineless weakness. Remember what Jesus was tempted by in Lk 4? Turning stones into bread, casting himself down from the temple to test his "sonship", and to take control of the earth and rule over it. Ruling the earth was obviously something that Jesus was tempted by, and he certainly could have achieved it by force. This is why we see such a harsh response to Peter, who expected Jesus to do just that. "Get behind me Satan!" Jesus was kind, gentle, compassionate, and submissive. Jesus was not weak. He knew, and was focused on the concerns of God instead of his own. He knew that it was only through submission to God's will that He would truly inherit the earth and establish His kingdom.

For such a powerful animal to completely, and willingly submit to the will of his rider was a perfect reminder of the kind of meekness that Jesus demonstrated and looks for in his followers. The more people look at your life, your behavior, your attitude, they should see someone who is wholeheartedly submissive to their master.
